Psalm 67

The psalmist wants the whole world to experience God's gracious providence and to respond in praise. Especially notable is the universal ('catholic') scope of the prayer. The title reads: 'To the leader: with stringed instruments. A Psalm*. A Song.'

Verse three is a refrain (see verse five). The prophet Amos reflects on God's justice:

Seek good and not evil, that you may live; and so YHWH, the God of hosts, will be with you, just as you have said. Hate evil and love good, and establish justice in the gate; it may be that YHWH, the God of hosts, will be gracious to the remnant of Joseph. Therefore thus says YHWH, the God of hosts, YHWH: In all the squares there shall be wailing; and in all the streets they shall say, "Alas! alas!"

They shall call the farmers to mourning, and those skilled in lamentation, to wailing; in all the vineyards there shall be wailing, for I will pass through the midst of you, says YHWH.

Alas for you who desire the day of YHWH! Why do you want the day of YHWH? It is darkness, not light; as if someone fled from a lion, and was met by a bear; or went into the house and rested a hand against the wall, and was bitten by a snake. Is not the day of YHWH darkness, not light, and gloom with no brightness in it?

I hate, I despise your festivals,

and I take no delight in your solemn assemblies.

Even though you offer me your burnt offerings

and grain offerings, I will not accept them;

and the offerings of well-being of your fatted animals I will not look upon.

Take away from me the noise of your songs;

I will not listen to the melody of your harps.

But let justice roll down like waters,

and righteousness like an ever flowing stream.

The trees of the field shall yield their fruit, and the earth shall yield its increase. They shall be secure on their soil; and they shall know that I am YHWH, when I break the bars of their yoke, and save them from the hands of those who enslaved them. They shall no more be plunder for the nations, nor shall the animals of the land devour them; they shall live in safety, and no one shall make them afraid. I will provide for them a splendid vegetation so that they shall no more be consumed with hunger in the land, and no longer suffer the insults of the nations. They shall know that I, YHWH their God, am with them, and that they, the house of Israel, are my people, says the Lord YHWH.
