# Pope Francis: Apostolic Letter to all Consecrated People

21 November 2014

## I. Aims of the Year of Consecrated Life

## Keep Watch n.10

‘We risk preserving sacralised “memories” that make it harder for us to come out of the *cave* of our comfort-zone. The Lord loves us *with everlasting affection* (see Isaiah 54:8): this confidence calls us to freedom.’

## Keep Watch n.18 (quotes Pope Francis)

‘Instead of being just a church that welcomes and receives by keeping the doors open, let us try also to be a church that finds new roads, that is able to step outside itself and go to those who do not attend Mass, to those who have left or are indifferent. The ones who leave sometimes do it for reasons that, if properly understood and assessed, can lead to a return. But that takes audacity and courage’(Pope Francis in interview with A. Spadaro).

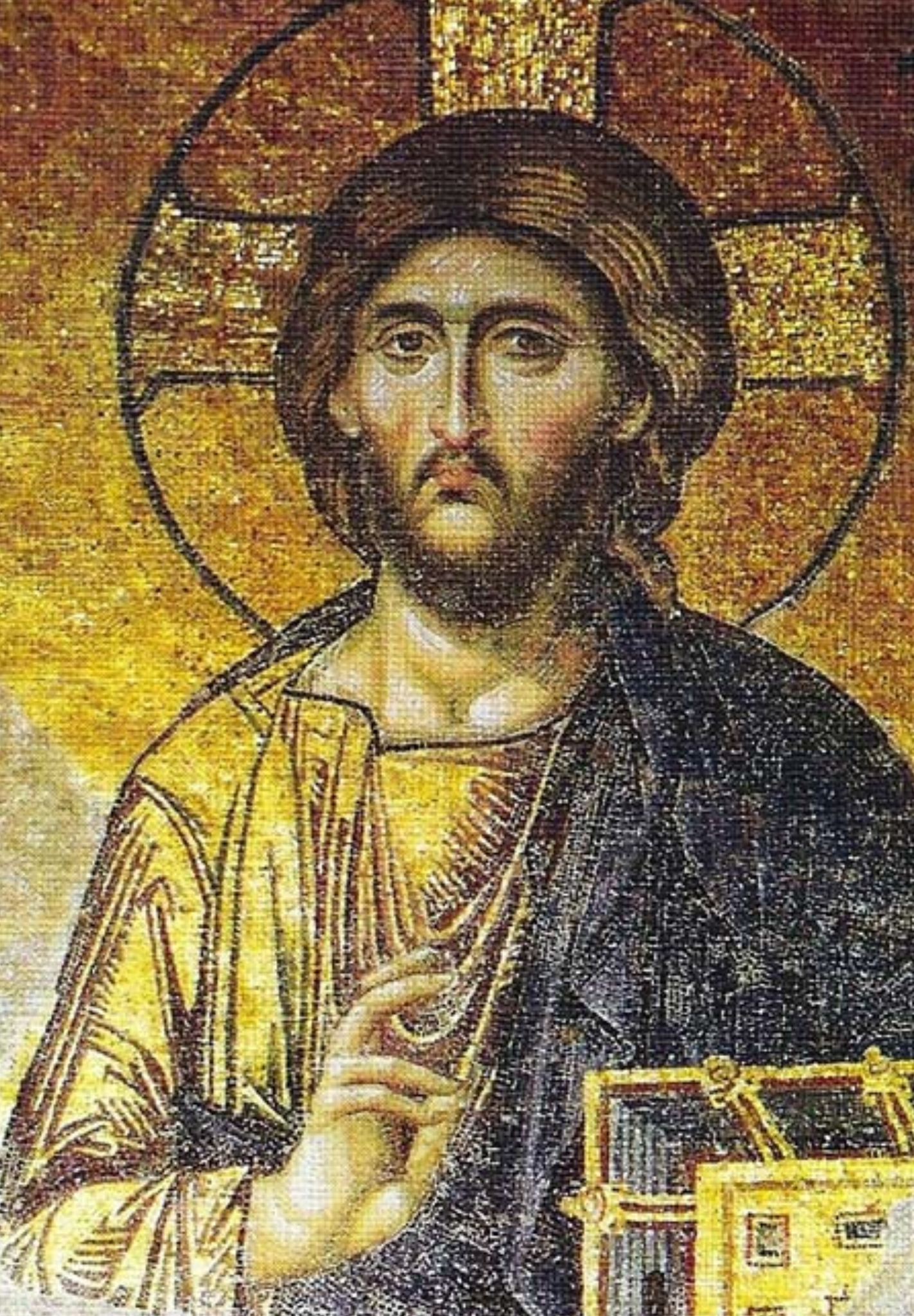

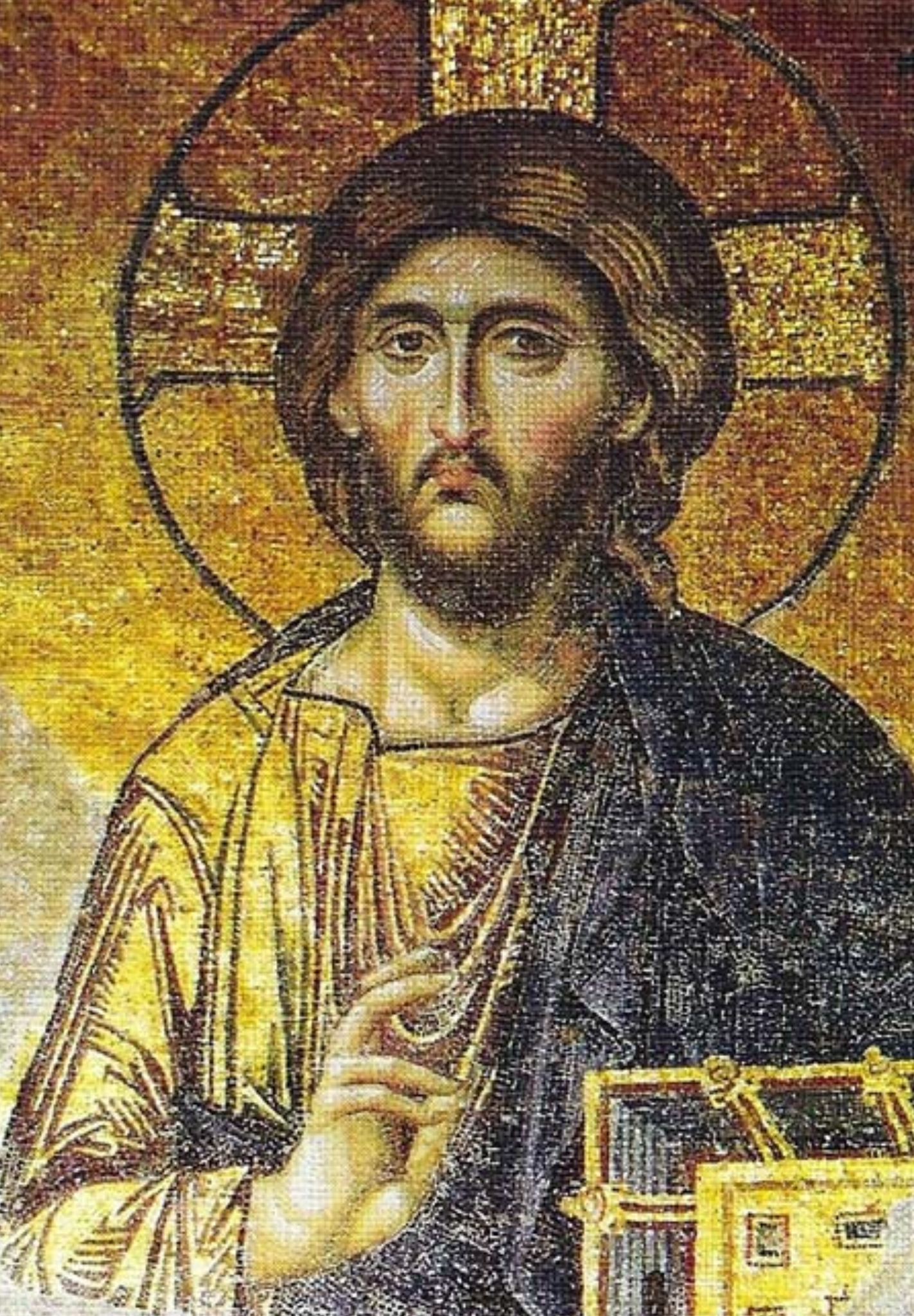

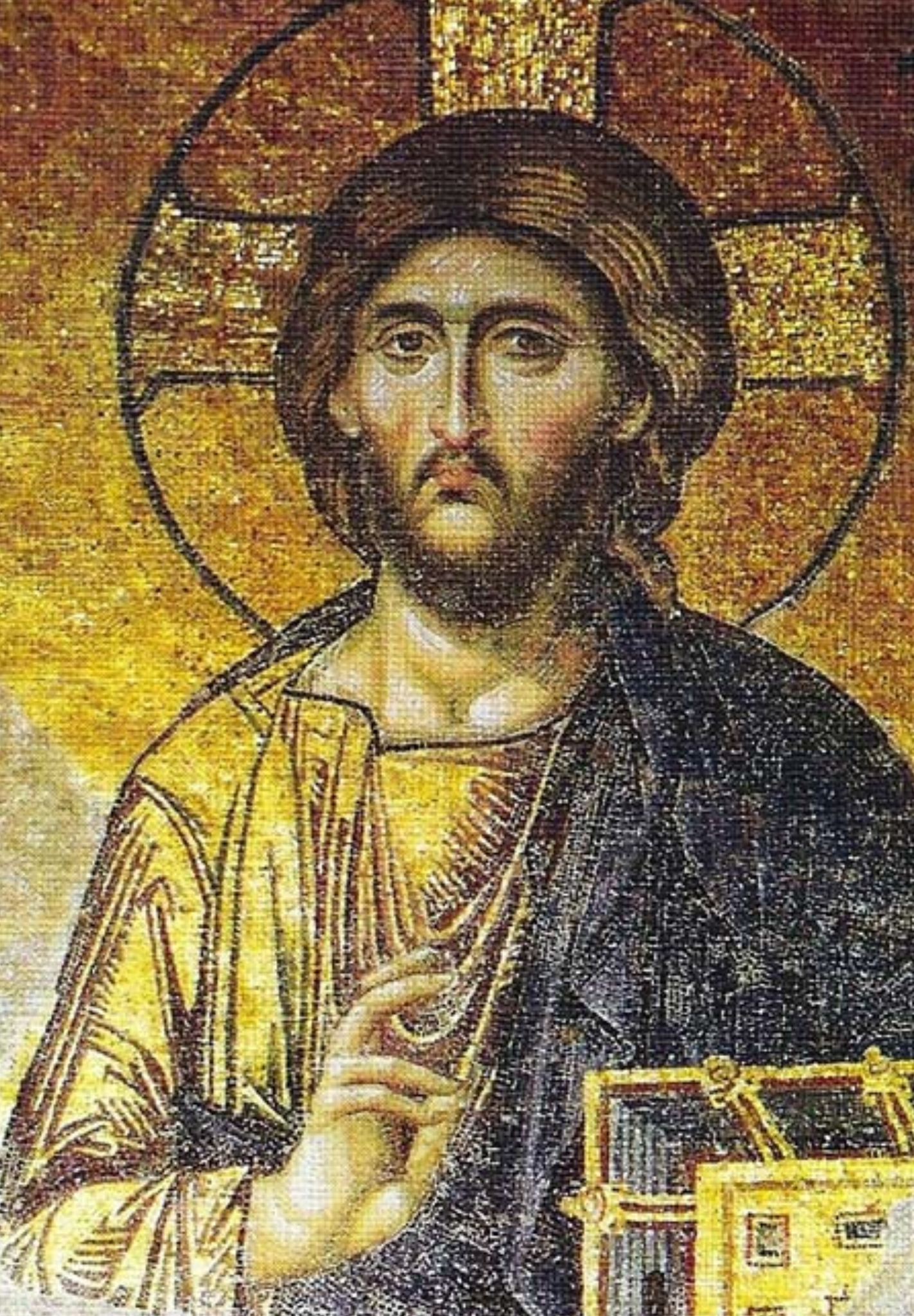




Come to set us free,

to your people, your chosen.

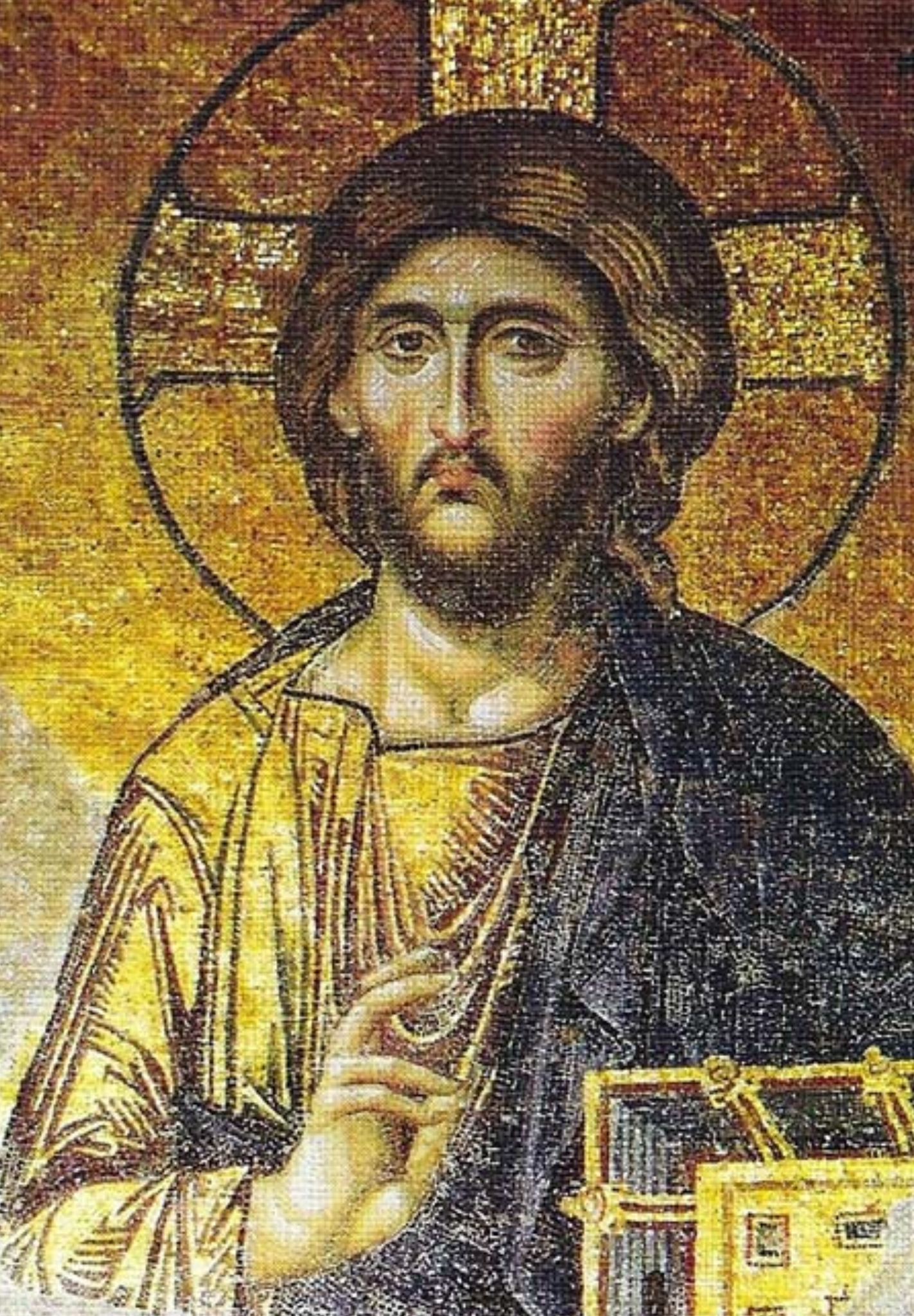
Open our lives

which sets us free.

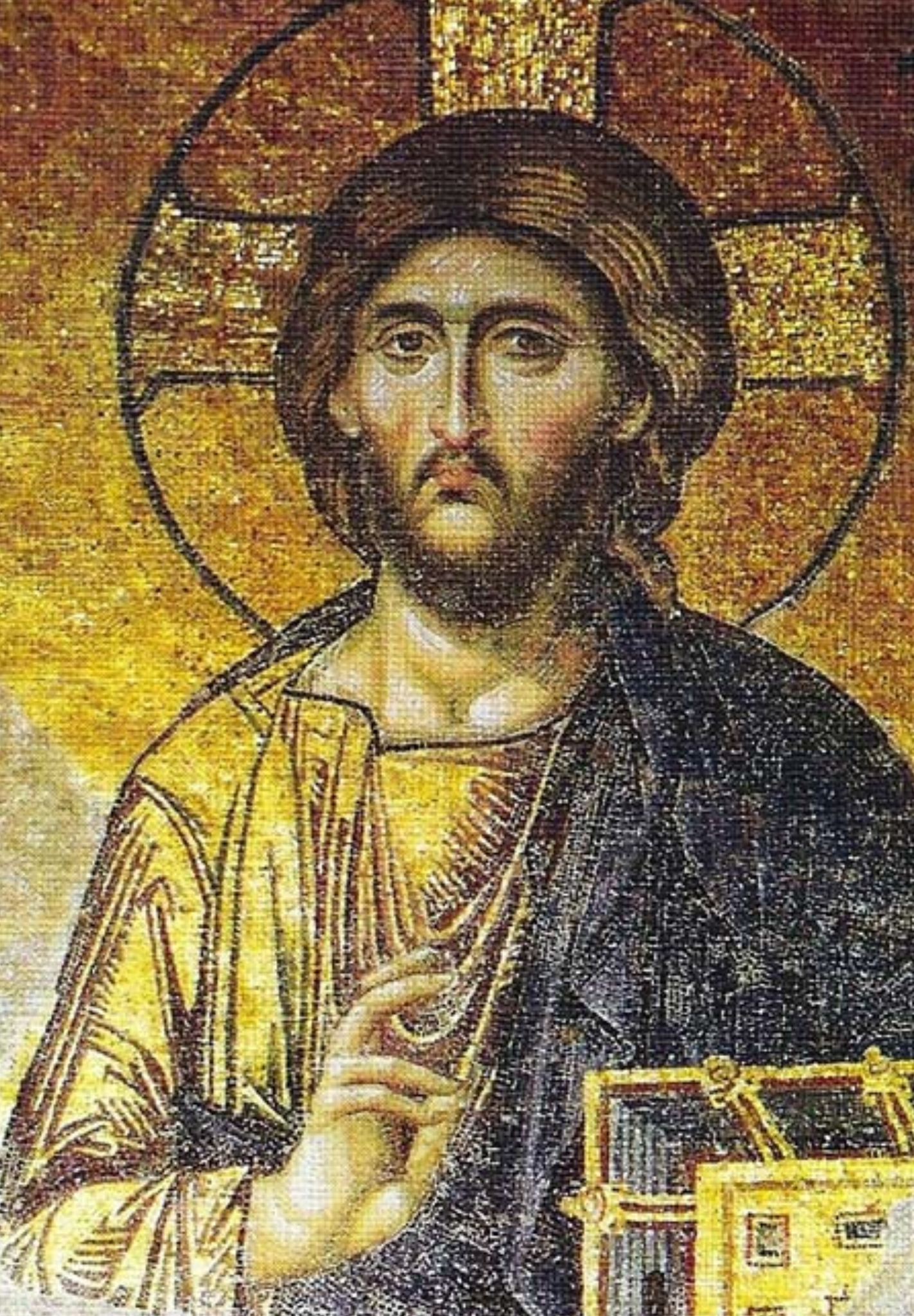
